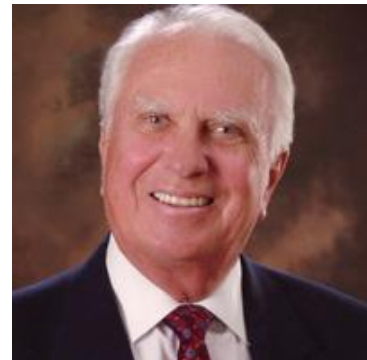

the Bishop of the Catholic Church of Brooklyn, New York. His journey eventually brought him to Shreveport after being recruited to work for Rucker Pharmacal.

With determination, vision, and the support of many local friends and colleagues, George and his wife, Joan, went on to found LuChem Pharmaceuticals. Their success in business was matched only by their dedication to family and community.

George and Joan became passionate advocates for Holy Angels because of their daughter, Lecia, who has called Holy Angels home. They recognized the exceptional care and support provided to residents and devoted themselves to making sure that future generations would benefit from the same loving environment.

George served on the Parents Board for Holy Angels and was a founding member of the Zita Trust. His leadership helped strengthen the foundation upon which Holy Angels continues to grow today.

That legacy continues through his son, Patrick Lukacs, and his daughter, Teri Lukacs Pringle. Both exemplify the spirit of servant leadership that their parents embraced so wholeheartedly.
